924 Heritage:



Established Ellington AFB, Dec 1962 Transferred from Ellington AFB to Bergstrom AFB, March 1976 Disestablished 27 Sept 1996

The 924th Troop Carrier Group, Medium, was established, activated, and allotted to the AF Reserve on 28 December 1962 . It was organized on 17 January 1963 as the 924th $\underline{\text{Troop Carrier Group}}$, part of the 446th $\underline{\text{Troop Carrier Wing}}$ located at Ellington AFB, Texas. Its early activities included providing special airdrop support to NASA during the Gemini and Apollo space programs. From 1962 to 1967, the unit flew the **C-119C & G** Flying Boxcars.

On 01 July 1967, the 924th converted to the *C-130A* Hercules and was redesignated the 924th <u>Tactical Airlift Group</u>, as part of the 446th Tactical Airlift <u>Wing</u> with HQ's at Ellington AFB. Unit members flew more than 120 missions to Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War.

In July 1972 the unit changed <u>Wings</u> and the 924th TAG became part of the 433rd Tactical Airlift Wing, located at Kelly AFB.

"The Alamo Wing".

March 1976, the group was relocated to Bergstrom AFB, eleven C130A's at Ellington AFB cranked up and relocated to Bergstrom AFB, where the unit became the first Reserve unit to be assigned there.

In 1977, the 924 TAG converted to eight C-130B's, as part of the 433rd TAW HQ's at Kelly AFB.

On 01 July 1981, the 924^{th} converted to the **F-4D** Phantom II and became known as 924th <u>Tactical Fighter Group</u>, as part of the 301^{st} Tactical Fighter <u>Wing</u> with HQ's located at Carswell AFB.

Jan 1989, the 924 TFG converted to the F-4E.

July 1991, the 924 TFG converted to the **F-16A** Fighting Falcons and became the 924th <u>Fighter Group</u> in Feb 1992. July 1994, the unit converted to the **F-16C**.

01 Oct 1994, the 924th Fighter Group became a Fighter Wing.

The 924th Fighter Wing was disestablished due to the closing of Bergstrom AFB.

27 Sept 1996, the keys were turned over to the City of Austin.

Washington, DC - Recent events have highlighted a loss of focus on certain critical matters within the Air Force. For the past 36 years I have been privileged to serve my country as an Airman in the United States Air Force in peacetime and combat. I was honored and humbled to be appointed the Air Force's 18th Chief of Staff and have been proud to serve our Airmen and their families. Upon taking office, I worked hard with Secretary Wynne to ensure the Air Force provided the right forces at the right time to help our Nation and allies win the Global War on Terror.

I think the honorable thing to do is to step aside. After consulting with my family, I intend to submit my request for retirement to Secretary Gates.
