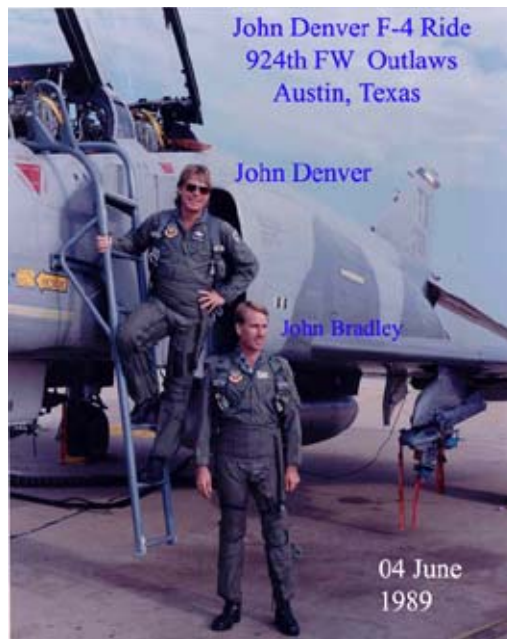

924 Heritage:



Established Ellington AFB, Dec 1962
Transferred from Ellington AFB to Bergstrom AFB, March 1976
Disestablished 27 Sept 1996

The 924th Troop Carrier Group, Medium, was established, activated, and allotted to the AF Reserve on 28 December 1962

. It was organized on 17 January 1963 as the 924th Troop Carrier Group, part of the 446th Troop Carrier Wing located at Ellington AFB, Texas. Its early activities included providing special airdrop support to NASA during the Gemini and Apollo space programs. From 1962 to 1967, the unit flew the **C-119C & G** Flying Boxcars.

On 01 July 1967, the 924th converted to the **C-130A** Hercules and was redesignated the 924th Tactical Airlift Group, as part of the 446th Tactical Airlift Wing with HQ's at Ellington AFB. Unit members flew more than 120 missions to Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War.

In July 1972 the unit changed Wings and the 924th TAG became part of the 433rd Tactical Airlift Wing, located at Kelly AFB, "The Alamo Wing".

March 1976, the group was relocated to Bergstrom AFB, eleven C130A's at Ellington AFB cranked up and relocated to Bergstrom AFB, where the unit became the first Reserve unit to be assigned there.

In 1977, the 924 TAG converted to eight **C-130B's**, as part of the 433rd TAW HQ's at Kelly AFB.

On 01 July 1981, the 924th converted to the **F-4D** Phantom II and became known as 924th Tactical Fighter Group, as part of the 301st Tactical Fighter Wing with HQ's located at Carswell AFB.

Jan 1989, the 924 TFG converted to the **F-4E**.

July 1991, the 924 TFG converted to the **F-16A** Fighting Falcons and became the 924th Fighter Group in Feb 1992.

July 1994, the unit converted to the **F-16C**.

01 Oct 1994, the 924th Fighter Group became a Fighter Wing.

The 924th Fighter Wing was disestablished due to the closing of Bergstrom AFB.

27 Sept 1996, the keys were turned over to the City of Austin .

Plan Ahead: Important Vet Info Whether Or Not You Plan To Live Forever...

Each week The War Library receives calls from anguished family members trying to hurdle the VA maze to get burial info or benefits for a deceased veteran because they cannot find the vet's Report of Separation or other military documents.

Whether or not you plan to live forever you MUST make arrangements for your death should your privately made plans to cheat 'The Grim Reaper' fail to work out. It is both unfair and callous to frustrate family members who run into VA roadblocks because you failed to pre-prepare all of the information they will need.

To spare your survivors the anguish of VA bureaucracy you should do the following NOW:

1. Prepare an 8-by-12 envelope containing the following veteran-related information to be left on a shelf or in a drawer that can be easily found after your death:

- a. a photocopy of your DD-214 (or Report of Separation) and other important military-issued documents
- b. a photocopy of your Social Security card
- c. a photocopy of your drivers license
- d. the location of the nearest VA Service Office for burial assistance benefits
- e. a duplicate set of your military medals to be buried with you
- f. the address and phone number of your local newspaper(s) to post your obit
- g. your military medal Last Will and Testament naming the person you entrust your primary medal set to
- h. the names and addresses of fellow veterans or veteran organizations you want your survivors to notify
- i. cassette tapes in your voice historicalizing your most memorable military experiences. (these tapes will become monetarily valuable over time/generations. .. you can make your great-great- grandchildren rich.)
- j. if applicable.. . the name(s) and last known locations of prior spouse(es) / mate(s) or child(ren) from any previous marriage(s) or relationship(s) you acquired in the US or abroad

I'm sure everybody has seen the latest e-mails. We are really getting very close to having her ready to fly. We might actually make the mid-late March fly time. We are tentatively scheduled for Randolph AFB, in late March. The chutes are supposed to be in next week. We seem to have some of the last leaks fixed. I think with a little "surge" effort we can do this! We need everybody's support now. We need to finish sheet metal maintenance, finish the airspeed/pitot static check, finish cockpit inspections, finish inspections and install the ejection seats, perform a #2 leak check engine run, install the remaining panels and doors, and perform a LOX system hot purge. It sounds like a lot but it's really a lot of small stuff.
