

Eric Alan Harrison, 21, a college student, passed away Tuesday, Aug. 13, 2013, as a result of a car accident. Funeral: 11:30 a.m. Saturday in Greenwood Chapel. Interment: Greenwood Memorial Park. Eric was born Oct. 1, 1991, in Georgetown to Henry and Debbie Arnett Harrison. He was a 2010 graduate of Fossil Ridge High School in the Keller ISD where he graduated 14th out of 470 students and was chosen for the Faculty Top 10. During high school, he played basketball and baseball and was a member of The Fellowship of Christian Athletes. He also sang in the choir and was in theater. He discovered his passion for theater and acting in middle school. This love of acting continued throughout high school where he was in the musical all four years and in numerous other plays. In his senior year, he was a Homecoming King nominee, Choir Student of the Year and Thespian of the Year.

Eric chose to pursue his passion for acting and theater into college where he was going to be a senior at West Texas A&M University in Canyon, majoring in theater performance. He was in numerous plays and musicals and had the lead role last fall in Iphigenia 2.0. For this role he received the Irene Ryan Acting Award nomination at the Kennedy Center American College Theater Festival in Shreveport, La. Eric was on the dean's list one semester and the president's list for the last five semesters. He also received multiple scholarships throughout his three years in college.

Eric was a devout Christian. His love for his family, friends and theater was only surpassed by his love for the Lord. He

was very active in First United Methodist Church of Watauga and the youth group. For five years he went on the youth mission trips where he was a leader in doing the Lord's work that he loved. He had a way of making everyone feel important, making them smile and bringing joy to everyone whose life he touched.

Eric loved children and spent his summers as a counselor at Hermann Sons Youth Camp in Comfort. While in college he began working for the Canyon After School Program keeping third and fourth graders.

Reservists win award in competition

Citizen-airmen from the Austia area took second place among Air Force Reserve units in the Air Forcewide airdrop competition in North Carolina recently.

Members oif the 23th Tactical Airlitt Group (Reserve) from Bergstrom came from last place after early maintenance competition to climb as high as third place overall during the week-long contest that included aircraft and teams of all C-130 wings in the Air Force and also select teams from the Air Forces of Canada, Great Britain, Australia and Germany.

The \$34th's poor start occurred when an unidentified object flew into a C-130's engine,

putting that engine out of commission.

The engine damage was discovered at Pope Air Force Base, N.C. about 1 p.m., July 14, with the flying competition scheduled to start at 3 s.m. the next day. The 924th flew another engine frem Bergsfrom to Pope, arriving about 9 p.m., July 14, and the 924th maintenenace crew worked all night getting the engine changed and ready for competition the next morning.

Then the \$26th alrerew and the unit's aerial porters, charged with preparing loads and getting them on the aircraft, get into the competition that included personnel drops on July 15, a container deliver system (CDS) (1,000-pound) drop on July 16, and a heavy equipment (3,500-pound) drop on July 17.

The Austin reservists had one of the top drops of paratroopers July 15 and antoher close drop on the container delivery system July 16 but lost some ground July 17 when dropping the heavy equipment load.

The 934th placed second in Air Force Reserve competition.

Mission commander for the Austin unit was Lt. Col. William Didlake with an aircrew of Lt. Col. Bobby Gassiott, Capts. Bruce Bennet and Steve Savell, SMSgt. Raul Cavazos, and MSgts. Airredo Pena and Jeffrey Voelts.

The maintenance team included SMSgt Frank Baxter, MSgt. Martin Reynolds, TSgts T. J. Allen, James Chapman, Mark Ellis, Ear Hall, Pablo Martines, Jack Nottingham, Richard Palmer and Gerrit Simmons.

VA reaches out to veterans about the health care law

WASHINGTON (AFRNS) -- The Department of Veterans Affairs has launched an awareness campaign and a new website, www.va.gov/aca, to let veterans know what the Affordable Care Act means for them and their families. Veterans receiving health care from the Department of Veterans Affairs will see no change in their benefits or out-of-pocket costs when portions of the Affordable Care Act take effect next year.

"VA wants all veterans to receive health care that improves their health and well-being," said Secretary of Veterans Affairs Eric K. Shinseki. "If you are enrolled in VA health care, you do not need to take any additional steps to meet the health care law coverage standards. If you are not enrolled in VA health care, you can apply at any time."

"VA encourages eligible veterans who are not enrolled in VA's health care system to take advantage of the world-class care we provide to the men and women who have served this nation in uniform," Shinseki added.

Veterans can apply for VA health care at any time by visiting www.va.gov/healthbenefits/enroll, calling 877-222-8387, or visiting their local VA health care facility. Full details on eligibility are available here.

VA's health care system for veterans has no enrollment fee, no monthly premiums and no deductibles. Most veterans also have no out-of-pocket costs, though some may have small copayments for some health care or prescription drugs.

"VA will continue to provide veterans with high quality, comprehensive health care and other benefits they have earned through their service," said Dr. Robert Petzel, VA's chief physician and under secretary for health.

The Affordable Care Act was created to expand access to coverage, reduce rising health care costs, and improve health care quality and care coordination. The Affordable Care Act creates new opportunities for coverage for uninsured veterans and their families.

There are more than 1.3 million veterans and more than 950,000 spouses and children of veterans without health insurance. Most uninsured veterans are eligible for VA health care. For those who are not eligible for VA care – such as veterans' family members – the law created a new Health Insurance Marketplace.

In 2014, the Marketplace will be a new way to shop for and purchase private health insurance. People who purchase insurance through the Marketplace may be able to lower the costs of health insurance coverage by paying lower monthly premiums. For more information, visit www.healthcare.gov.

For information about VA health care and the Affordable Care Act, people can visit the new website or call 877-222-8387, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 10 p.m., or Saturdays 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., Eastern time. The new website includes a Health Benefits Explorer, where veterans can learn about the benefits they can receive if they enroll in VA care.

NOW SHE IS A TEACHER!!! Veterans

In September of 2005, on the first day of school, Martha Cothren, a History teacher at Robinson High School in Little Rock, did something not to be forgotten. On the first day of school, with the permission of the school superintendent, the

principal and the building supervisor, she removed all of the desks in her classroom. When the first period kids entered the room they discovered that there were no desks, 'Ms, Cothren, where are our desks?' She replied, 'You can't have a desk until you tell me how you earn the right to sit at a desk.' They thought, 'Well, maybe it's our grades.' 'No,' she said. 'Maybe it's our behavior.' She told them, 'No, it's not even your behavior.' And so, they cam e and went, the first period, second period, third period. Still no desks in the classroom. Kids called their parents to tell them what was happening and by early afternoon television news crews had started gathering at the school to report about this crazy teacher who had taken all the desks out of her room. The final period of the day came and as the puzzled students found seats on the floor of the desk-less classroom. Martha Cothren said, 'Throughout the day no one has been able to tell me just what he or she has done to earn the right to sit at the desks that are ordinarily found in this classroom. Now I am going to tell you.' At this point, Martha Cothren went over to the door of her classroom and opened it. Twenty-seven (27) U.S. Veterans, all in uniform, walked into that classroom, each one carrying a school desk. The Vets began placing the school desks in rows, and then they would walk over and stand alongside the wall. By the time the last soldier had set the final desk in place those kids started to understand, perhaps for the first time in their lives, just how the right to sit at those desks had been earned. Martha said, 'You didn't earn the right to sit at these desks. These heroes did it for you. They placed the desks here for you. They went halfway around the world, giving up their education and interrupting their careers and families so you could have the freedom you have. Now, it's up to you to sit in them. It is your responsibility to learn, to be good students, to be good citizens. They paid the price so that you could have the freedom to get an education. Don't ever forget it.'

By the way, this is a true story. And this teacher was awarded Veterans of Foreign Wars Teacher of the Year for the State of Arkansas in 2006. She is the daughter of a WWII POW.

Do you think this is worth passing along so others won't forget either, that the freedoms we have in this great country were earned by our U.S. Veterans? I did.
